

SAT EXTENDED TIME INFORMATION

The extended time application for College Board's SAT can be found in the Guidance Office or from a Study Support teacher, Mrs. Peck or Mr. Eineker located in room 218. Students wishing to apply for extended time on the SAT can complete this application at any time (*unlike ACT who asks the student to register for test on the extended time application*). Therefore students who qualify and use extended time on a regular basis are strongly encouraged to apply for accommodation as soon as they have taken the PSAT and realize they might want to take the SAT with extended time as well.

Students who meet all of the following requirements do NOT need to send documentation (psycho-educational testing) with the application:

The student's testing is current or no older than 5 years.

The student's testing includes at least one Cognitive Ability Test and at least one Academic Achievement Test

The student is has been using the requested accommodation for at least 4 school months

The student is in (or has been in) Study Support for at least 4 months

The student has a diagnosed disability.

*Any student who does not meet every requirement outlined above must send documentation (psycho-educational testing) with the application. College Board needs approximately seven weeks once the application and documentation is received to process the request.

*If no documentation (psycho-educational testing) needs to be sent with the application, College Board needs approximately five weeks to process the request.

SAT (College Board) Extended time Checklist:

Using a no. 2 pencil, fill out the Section 1: Student Information on pages 1 and 2. (The 6-digit High School Code is 110226)

Return the application in its envelope (with a copy of the testing if required) to Mrs. Peck or Mr. Eineker before SPX Submission Deadline (outlined in the box above).

KABC-II: Kaufman Adolescent and Adult Intelligence Test or Kaufman Assessment Battery for Children, Second Edition

DAS-II: Differential Ability Scales, Second Edition

RIAS: Reynolds Intellectual Assessment Scales

SDRT: Stanford Diagnostic Reading Tests, Fourth Edition (When individually-administered)

WIAT II: Wechsler Individual Achievement Test with reading rate measure

GMRT®: Gates-MacGinitie Reading Tests® Fourth Edition (When individually-administered)

Stanford Diagnostic Mathematics Test, Fourth Edition (When individually-administered)
